III. The Three Main Characteristics of the Vital Groups

A. Purpose--for the Increase, the Perfecting, and the Building up of the Church

Acts 2:46-47

- **46** And day by day, continuing steadfastly with one accord in the temple and breaking bread from house to house, they partook of *their* food with exultation and simplicity of heart,
- 47 Praising God and having grace with all the people. And the Lord added together day by day those who were being saved

For the perfecting of the saints unto the work of the ministry, unto the building up of the Body of Christ,

B. Nature—Spiritual

1. To Be Spiritual Means to Be Filled with the Holy Spirit, Within and Without

Acts 13:52

And the disciples were filled with joy and with the Holy Spirit

Acts 4:31b

...and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak the word of God with boldness.

2. In Acts the Disciples Experienced the Outpoured Spirit Again and Again

Acts 2:1, 4

- 1 And as the day of Pentecost was being fulfilled, they were all together in the same place...
- **4** And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, even as the Spirit gave to them to speak forth.

C. Condition—Love (loving one another in oneness and with one accord)

I have had the opportunity to serve in many different countries and churches, and it has been my experience and observation that the churches can take two different ways to gain the increase. **One way** is to get everyone excited to preach the gospel and to do a work of effort to gain the increase. However, in the end this way does not produce much increase.

The other way to gain the increase is the way of love. When there is the element of love between all the saints, this love overflows to the unbelievers, and when this happens, there is the increase. It is not our working that brings in people. Doing a great work may be effective to a certain degree, but the greatest work, the work that produces the most increase, is the work that is out of love.

Love is the way of the vital groups, which Brother Lee showed to us and into which we must enter. The very element and expression of the vital groups should be love. In the vital groups we should love the members, and when the Lord brings us in contact with a new one, we should love him into the church. The vital groups are absolutely of the Lord, and this way of living in the vital groups and carrying out the vital groups will produce great results. However, for there to be the increase, one element must be present—love. If in a vital group love prevails and love is the center of everything, there will be the increase. If we love one another and all the new ones, if we pray for the new ones and for one another, and if we have fellowship, the Lord will bless us with the increase. Moreover, if all the vital groups gain the increase, the church will gradually grow. The way to gain the increase is not by our endeavoring or working but by love. Love produces the greatest result.—B.P. (The Ministry Magazine, vol. 10, No. 5, pp. 170-171)

IV. The Vital Groups are Living and Active

A. Living

1. Personally--by Thorough Fellowship with the Lord

Proverbs 8:17 I love those who love me, And those who seek me diligently will find me.

You may say, "Well, the Lord has not come to me yet." But I would say, "The Lord is waiting for you. You need to go to Him." The Lord is within you, but you may not care to listen to Him. He is speaking all the time. You need to stop yourself from all other things. Go to a closed room, to a mountaintop, or to some other place to be with the Lord for a personal time. The only thing that has helped me and that can help you is to contact the Lord directly. No one can escape from the Lord's presence. He is the source. Go to Him and you will be enlightened.

2. Corporately—By Thorough <u>Fellowship with One Another</u>—Fellowship, Prayer and Care

Hebrews 10:24 And let us consider one another so as to incite *one another* to love and good works.

1 Corinthians 12:25 That there would be no division in the body, but *that* the members would have the same care for one another.

Philippians 2:25a But I considered it necessary to send to you Epaphroditus, my brother and fellow worker and fellow soldier, and your apostle and minister to my need,...

Footnote 25¹ First a brother, then a fellow worker, and then a fellow soldier.

By considering the Word, we can see that there was much fellowship, interceding for one another, mutual care, and shepherding. The fellowship brings the awareness of one another's condition and situation. This will lead into prayer for one another. This will then cause us to go to one another to render a mutual care. Through the fellowship we may find out that a brother has been in an automobile accident. This leads us to pray for him and his family. Then we may consider his financial needs and be burdened to care for his health needs. All of this should not be in a formal way. It should be a spontaneous issue of the Spirit. I hope that from now on we can have all our group meetings in such an organic way.

B. Active—By Thorough <u>Fellowship with One Another</u>—Fellowship, Prayer, <u>Coordination</u>

In our group meeting in these days, we have to <u>pray for our work</u> of contacting people. Then we should <u>fellowship about the situation with our contacts</u>, so that we can <u>study their cases</u>, fellowship about them, and receive the mutual help. After your study, <u>we should pray again</u>. This kind of practice will be very practical, useful, and vital. Then you can <u>decide whom you should contact</u> and by what way. We have to believe that what we are doing by the vital groups will not be in vain, because this is a very practical sowing. Surely there will be the real reaping.

The Critical Role of the Homes to Carry out the God-ordained Way

I. The Homes being containers to retain the new ones we have contacted on the Campus and in the Community

When it comes to God's work, the beginning is always the best. After it is handed over to man, it begins to go downhill. The beginning of Acts was the best. There was the "skating rink" in the big meetings to skate people in. Many skated in. Then there were the meetings from house to bring people into the foundation of the church.

Once a person joined the home meetings, he was kept. This is God's wisdom.

On Home Meetings, Chapter 1

In the past our failure was that we only had the big meetings and did not build up the home meetings, so we did not have a place to store the water. It was like giving birth to children with no place to raise them. Now we have found that the home meetings are the right place for the new ones to grow up and live. Therefore, we all must see clearly that the new way depends on the home meetings, and the home meetings depend on how we lead and perfect the new ones.

The home is a steady and stabilizing unit. Those who are saved in the homes grow up in the homes. Since they are built up in the homes, it is not easy to lose them. In the past the church life was like a social club. When a person was saved, he was frequently ignored because of lack of care and concern. Now the church must be built up in the homes. When a person is saved and baptized, he will not be dropped. Rather, the fruit will remain and be strong. A. Providing a Base for the Dispensing of Christ

Acts 5:42 And every day, in the temple and from house to house, they did not cease teaching and announcing the gospel of Jesus *as* the Christ.

It would be very profitable if the saints could acquire a house that would be a station for the work among the students...If this couple together with all the saints help the students, take care of their needs, prepare meals and snacks for them, and even wash and mend their clothes, the students' hearts will be touched. **Then it will be easy for us to dispense Christ into them**.

However, we still need another practical help to make our gospel preaching work prevailing. If we only have prayer and the word without this little help, our work will not be as effective as possible. This little additional help is the homes...

Our homes have several advantages. In America many freshmen attend college away from home. Since they are considered full-grown, they may leave home once they have graduated from high school. Many of them are lonely and homesick. If we invite them into our living rooms for a little snack or perhaps a dinner, they will feel at home and this will open them to the Lord and the truth. Furthermore, people do not have a goal and they are tired of their old manner of life. This situation is sovereign of the Lord. Once a young person graduates from high school, he usually begins to think about the goal and meaning of his life. Many young people today do not have a goal. They are wondering what to do and where to go. They do not have a goal in their human life. The material riches of America cannot satisfy the hearts of the young people. Therefore, we must take this opportunity to fill up the gap in their hearts with Christ. The best way to do this is by opening up our homes.

Once a freshman is brought into your living room, most of the work is already done.
